What is a Script Planner?

- A script planner is a document that helps you organize and outline the content and structure of a video before recording
- This is essentially the blueprint for the video content, helping you organize thoughts, ideas, and critical points that need to be covered in the video

Why Use a Script Planner?

- A script planner ensures everyone is on the same page, from the person in front of the camera and behind
- Helps reduce errors and improvisation which saves time and creates a more professional feel
- This helps create consistency and quality content for your video library

Script Planner

Tips before you Start:

- Use the same outline for each video
- Talk directly to the user watching the workflow
- Provide clear definitions if necessary and explanations as to why
- Recap at the end what the user should have learned

Name of Video: Clear and Concise Title that reflects the topic or Purpose of the video

Introduction:

- Begin with a brief introduction that captures the attention of the viewers and provides an overview of the training material
 - Introductions can start with "Hello, My name is..", "The goal of this video is...", etc.
- State the objectives and goals of the training video to set clear expectations
- Call out Pre-requisites like PPE, tools needed, and definitions that may be foreign

Main Content:

- Potentially start with a definition to recap for users who may not know what the terminology is
- Break down the training content into step-by-step
- Potentially provide background info to explain why each step is necessary
- Incorporate examples as you are explaining it to reinforce learning

Summarization and Conclusion:

- End each video with a brief summary, highlighting what the user should be able to accomplish now
- Encourage the user to practice the learned skill

Example Script:

Title: How to Change the Thumbnail Image on a Workflow - Clear and concise



Introduction:

Hi, today I'm going to show you how to change the thumbnail picture on a workflow while in the editor. *Introduces the purpose of the video*

First, let's define thumbnail. A thumbnail is a still image that is a preview image for your video.

When a video has an enticing thumbnail, viewers are more likely to watch it, which will increase engagement with the content

Main Content:

Changing thumbnails can be done either when workflows are unpublished or published.

However, you have to be within the editor in order to change this thumbnail picture.

- 1. So if you hover over here on the top and it's a published video, it's going to ask you "Do you want to unpublish the video?"
- 2. You'll say yes.

- 3. Click on the picture.
- 4. And then select from the video.
- 5. So I'm going play to pinpoint the part I want
- 6. Or you can slide through So I think right around here this is the new thumbnail picture that I'd like
- 7. I'll click Select
- 8. You can zoom in or out if you want and then once you
- 9. Once you have Selected the picture that you want, just click done.
- 10. And now you'll see it's changed here and you'll go ahead and publish the workflow.
- 11. And then once you're done, you'll see that it's changed right here.
